The Issue

Many Georgians, including working caregivers, do not have access to an employer provided retirement program.

17 other states have either passed legislation or are considering legislation to create these public-private partnerships for small businesses to offer their employees a retirement savings plan that is portable and no cost to the employer.

The Ask

Legislation would create the state-run program for caregivers and working Georgians to have an opportunity to offer employees a benefit of a retirement savings.

The Georgia Council on Aging (GCOA) and the Coalition of Advocates for Georgia's Elderly (CO-AGE) recommends that legislation be passed to create a formal Work and Save program for the state of Georgia.
